

Visitation

Last year the Cathedral Chapter invited Bishop Stephen to do a Visitation of the Cathedral. This is an external inspection which looks at the whole of the Cathedral's mission and ministry and then makes a report on their findings to the Bishop.

That in turn becomes the Bishop's recommendations to the Chapter going forward.



It is an ancient practice, but is best described as a "friendly Ofsted" inspection. It is there to give the Bishop and the Cathedral a clear analysis of what is happening and some powerful recommendations for the future, which are published in the public domain.

The Bishop has appointed a dynamic team led by the former Dean of St Paul's, and they will be visiting the Cathedral 18 - 25 May. There will be opportunities for everyone to contribute - look out for more information in the weekly news.

Study Notes on the Sunday Gospel

Reading: Luke 24:13-35

Introduction & Context

Late on Easter Day two of Jesus' followers walk to Emmaus, talking about the recent startling events. Jesus walks with them but they do not recognize him. He asks "What things?" (v. 19). Their reply shows the limitations of their understanding. Jesus has disappointed them: they expected him to deliver Israel from the Romans, and begin an earthly kingdom of God ("redeem Israel", v. 21). Three days have passed and, despite Jesus' statement that he would be raised from death, nothing has happened! The women told us that he is alive, but when Peter and John went there, all they saw was the empty tomb! (v. 24).

Jesus tells them how slow they are to grasp how the Old Testament prophecies are fulfilled in him. Was it not God's plan ("necessary", v. 26) that Jesus should be crucified and ascend to be with the Father? He interprets his life as a fulfilment of all of Scripture, from "Moses" (v. 27, the first five books of the Bible) to "all the prophets". The meal seems to be a Eucharist: "he took bread, blessed and broke it" (v. 30). Then, from Jesus' interpretation and their hospitality to this "stranger" (v. 18) "their eyes were opened" (v. 31). At the Last Supper, Jesus said he would not again share food with his disciples until God's kingdom came. He has now eaten with the two, so the Kingdom has indeed come. "The Lord has risen indeed ... !" (v. 34).

Once you are settled and are ready to go:

- Read the passage slowly and reflectively
- Note anything that particularly strikes you and refer to the notes if they are helpful
- Spend a few moments in quiet reflection
- If you are a group, share your reflections in pairs or as a whole group (remembering that each person will have different perspectives and views on the passage)
- Read the passage for a final time and give thanks to God for the gift of his holy word.
