CAFÉ JAZZ

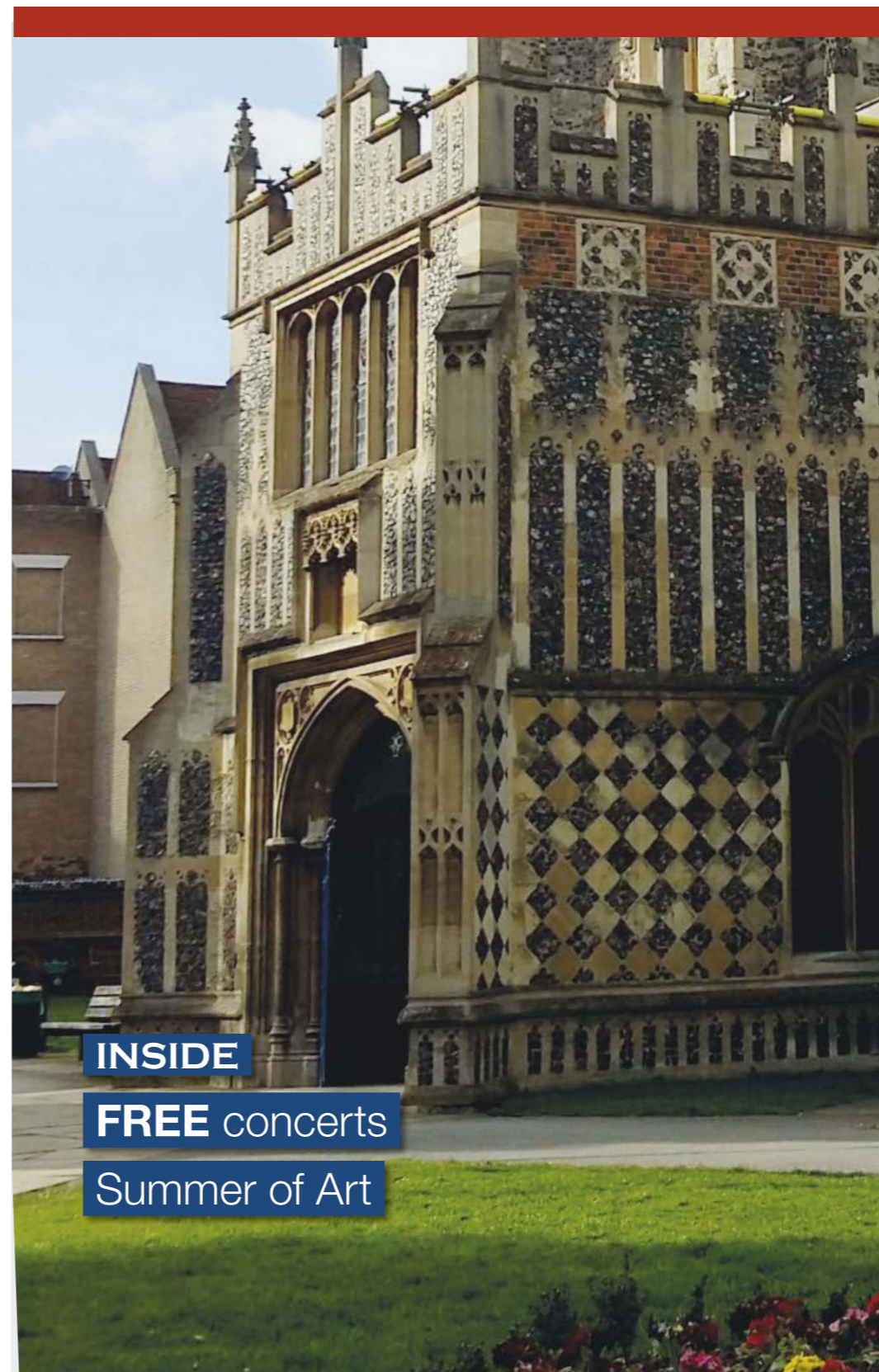
