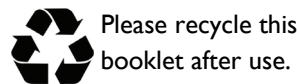

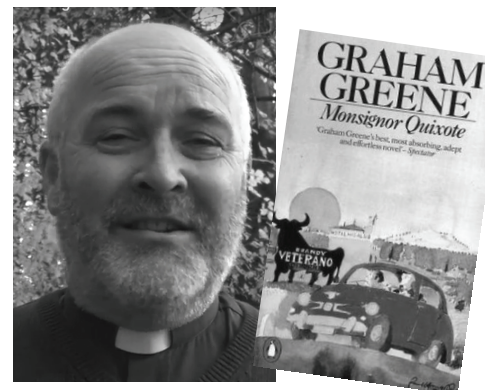

This week **Ash Wednesday** begins the season of Lent, a season kept by Christians for penitence and study. At the Cathedral this year there are three particular extra opportunities for learning and reflection, open to all.

On the five Wednesday evenings from 21st February, five different speakers will reflect on novels that

have inspired them in their faith. On 7th March the speaker is Bishop Stephen of Chelmsford, talking about Graham Greene's *Monsignor Quixote*.

The Wednesday daytime group will be using a course called *The Psalms — prayers for today's Church*. Meetings are at 11.00am in the Chapter House.

During Lent, Breakfast with the Bible will be studying the Passion Narrative from John's Gospel. This meets every Sunday in St Cedd's Hall between the 8.00am and 9.30am services.

Study Notes on the Sunday Gospel

Mark 9.2-9

Introduction & Context

“Six days” (v. 2) after Peter’s recognition of Jesus as the Messiah, Jesus takes Peter and James and John up a mountain. There he is “transfigured”, appearing in “dazzling white” (v. 3), like Moses (Exodus 34:29). “Elijah” (v. 4) was taken up into heaven. Moses’ burial place was unknown (see Deuteronomy 34:6); in late Judaism, he was also thought to be taken up. (Others point out that Elijah represents the prophets and Moses the law, the basic authority in Judaism.) Peter rejoices in this experience (“good”, v. 5): it is a preview of Jesus’ glorification as God’s Son. He wishes to prolong the event by making “dwellings”, temporary shelters as erected at the Feast of Tabernacles, a joyous festival of God’s presence. V. 6 may say that he was so dumbfounded by the experience that what he said was irrational. The “cloud” (v. 7) is a symbol of God’s presence. The proclamation spoken by the divine voice is like that at Jesus’ baptism (see 1:11). The Son of Man is revealed to be Son of God. The vision ends “suddenly” (v. 8). Then v. 9: only when Jesus has risen will the vision make sense to others.

Once you are settled and are ready to go:

- Read the passage slowly and reflectively
- Note anything that particularly strikes you and refer to the notes if they are helpful
- Spend a few moments in quiet reflection
- If you are a group, share your reflections in pairs or as a whole group (remembering that each person will have different perspectives and views on the passage)
- Read the passage for a final time and give thanks to God for the gift of his holy word.
