What's Going On For Children and Young People?

At Chelmsford Cathedral, our work with children and young people is constantly evolving. If you're a young person, a parent, or are someone who wants to make sure our children get the best foundation in life and faith, why not get involved?

Junior Church takes place in Chapter House at 9.30am every Sunday in term-time and there are two youth groups, both of which meet on Monday evenings. This is a time to play games and socialise, as well as to participate in conversations and learn about life and faith.

We run an LGBT group in partnership with Essex Youth Service on alternate Wednesday evenings. The group is open to all, but is particularly focussed on offering a safe and friendly space for young people who identify as LGBT+.

Girls between the ages of 11 and 18 can audition to be a part of our Girls' Cathedral Choir, and boys aged eight and above can do the same to join the Boys' Choir. We also run a choral scholarship scheme, with school-age, gap year or postgrad students. The choirs are a key part of our



worshipping life at the Cathedral, and they present great opportunities for choristers to develop their talents and experience.

We are proud partners of the 4th Chelmsford Guides and 6th Chelmsford Scouts. These groups offer children from age 5 to 18 a jam-packed programme, full of fun, adventure, and important life skills!

There are also plenty of opportunities for young people to get involved in church services in any number of roles: we are always on the lookout for welcomers, sidespeople, Continued page 3

Study Notes on the Sunday Gospel

John 15.26-27; 16.4b-15

Introduction & Context

After the Last Supper, Jesus continues to tell the disciples about the mission they are to undertake. The “Advocate” (a legal term in Greek just as it is in English) is the Holy Spirit, the “spirit of truth”, and will be sent to the disciples “from the Father” to continue Christ’s work in the world (15:27). Then 16:7: by leaving them, Jesus is able to send the Spirit.

Then 16:12-13: the Spirit will tell them things Jesus has not. In his guidance, he will speak what comes to him from God (as Jesus has spoken what the Father has told him.) The Spirit will prophesy about events “to come”. The Spirit will reveal the essential nature of God, and show Christ’s essential nature and power (“glorify”, 16:14). Whether the word comes from the Father, the Son, or the Spirit it is the same.

Once you are settled and are ready to go:

- Read the passage slowly and reflectively
- Note anything that particularly strikes you and refer to the notes if they are helpful
- Spend a few moments in quiet reflection
- If you are a group, share your reflections in pairs or as a whole group (remembering that each person will have different perspectives and views on the passage)
- Read the passage for a final time and give thanks to God for the gift of his holy word.

As part of our outward-facing mission, we also offer chaplaincy to the Cathedral School, the YMCA, and The Priory Hospital. In this work, we meet with children and young people, as well as staff and parents, to offer a listening ear, and faith and spiritual support.
