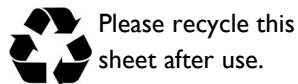

Study Notes on the Sunday Gospel

Readings for Trinity I:

Galatians 3.23-29
Psalm 22.19-28
Luke 8.26-39

Declare how much God has done for you!

In the **First Reading** Paul is speaking about the extraordinary, breathtaking freedom that Christ has given us, breaking down every wall and barrier – “There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus.”

The Psalm is a response in praise for God’s love which is without limit—even or especially when we are struggling.

And the **Gospel** is the familiar but highly dramatic healing of the Gerasene demoniac whose encounter with Jesus brings him back to his senses, and he in turn “went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.”

Despite so much bad news in our world, let each of us this week find a space and a time to thank God for his good news and the gifts he gives us, the fullness of life to which he invites us all.
