## Study Notes on the Sunday Gospel

### John 18.33-37

#### Introduction & Context

This is part of John's account of Jesus' trial before Pilate. Here Pilate goes inside the praetorium and asks Jesus: *are you the leader of a revolutionary movement?* In return, Jesus asks him: *Is this question your idea, based on what you have heard, or did others put you up to it?* Pilate shows his scorn for Jews; *the religious authorities seek your death, but what grounds are there for killing you?* In v. 36, Jesus begins to explain the nature of his kingship. Were he a rebel leader, his followers "would be fighting to keep me from being handed over" to the religious authorities, but he is no threat to Pilate's authority. Pilate picks up on Jesus words "my kingdom". Jesus is king of "truth" (v. 37); his subjects are those who belong to the truth. He was "born" and "came into the world" to establish the kingdom of God, the ultimate truth.

#### Once you are settled and are ready to go:

- Read the passage slowly and reflectively
- Note anything that particularly strikes you and refer to the notes if they are helpful
- Spend a few moments in quiet reflection
- If you are a group, share your reflections in pairs or as a whole group (remembering that each person will have different perspectives and views on the passage)
- Read the passage for a final time and give thanks to God for the gift of his holy word.
